



Rules for parents

 <p>I don't go to school</p>	<p>This page outlines some of the practical information contained in the regulations and co-responsibility pact, in line with the various decrees and instructions provided by the Ministry of Health. Many of these rules are necessary to avoid social gathering and limit the spread of epidemics. This strengthened school-family alliance will allow us to face the challenges of the new school year.</p>
 <p>Stay at home if you are not well</p>	<p>If your son/daughter shows flu-like symptoms: high temperature and/or sore throat, nasal congestion, conjunctivitis, reduced sense of taste/smell or vomiting, HE/SHE MUST STAY AT HOME and THEIR PEDIATRICIAN MUST BE INFORMED. If the child has allergies or other conditions which result in sneezing, red eyes etc. the parent must inform the class teacher and provide a certificate from their pediatrician. They must of course also stay at home if a member of the family tests positive for SARS-Cov2.</p>
 <p>Arrive at school on time.</p>	<p>Pupils must be accompanied to the interior of the school building by <u>one person only</u>. This person must wear a mask at all times. MAXIMUM PUNCTUALITY IS REQUIRED when ENTERING and when LEAVING the school. Please check the timetable very carefully (see bottom of the page)! Late arrivals create serious organizational problems. Pupils who arrive late will gather with the <i>collaboratore scolastico</i> who will take them to their classes. Authorised late arrivals and early departures will only be possible for reasons of high importance. PARENTS WILL NOT BE ALLOWED TO ENTER THE INTERIOR OF THE SCHOOL BUILDING unless they have been called or they have to pick up their child before the end of the school day. Any notifications can be written in school diaries or by email. Explanations for absences or late arrivals must be provided using the electronic register.</p>
 <p>Enter the school at the correct time and at the correct door, wearing a mask at all times and following the signs</p>	<p>Each pupil must follow the route which has been laid out for his/her class for both entrance and exit, taking account of the complexity of the buildings and respecting the RSPP (Prevention and Protection Officer). In the school interior both pupils and parents must wear masks correctly, arrive at the correct time and leave as soon as possible. Pupils will go to class following their teacher's instructions. Signs indicating the one way movement system, safe distances etc. are also displayed in the interior of the school building.</p>
 <p>School bags must contain only objects which are required by the class teacher.</p>	<p>Pupils must bring a school bag containing only the materials necessary for lessons, which must be sanitised as much as possible. Toys, stickers etc may not be brought to school. Take note of the material required by the class teacher. Pupils must also bring a water bottle with their name written on it, a container for their mask and paper handkerchiefs. On days when the pupil will have physical education, gym shoes must be placed inside a canvas bag before they are put into his/her school bag.</p>

 <p>Sorry but you can't hug your friends</p>	<p>There are undoubtedly many changes which we must now deal with. One of these is avoiding physical contact.</p>
 <p>Don't exchange your materials or water bottle with your friends</p>	<p>It is important to provide your child with the necessary materials. When possible, write your child's name or a symbol on your child's materials. Sharing materials between classmates is not permitted.</p>
 <p>Igienizza di frequente le mani</p>	<p>It is very important to follow rules relating to hygiene, including frequent hand washing or use of sanitisation gel. Children will find gel constantly available. This will be administered under adult supervision. Therefore, for health and safety reasons, SANITISING GEL MAY NOT BE BROUGHT FROM HOME.</p>
 <p>Sneeze and cough into your elbow</p>	<p>Children must use the inside of their elbow to sneeze or cough. Each pupil must carry disposable tissues, which they will throw away after every use.</p>
 <p>You can take your mask off in class and in the dinner hall once you have sat down.</p>	<p>Classroom desks are for one pupil and are adequately distanced, using the markings on the floor. In some classrooms there are still two-person desks (one-person desks have been ordered) but places have been assigned respecting social distancing regulations. Once pupils and their teacher have all sat down, masks may be removed. Masks may also be removed during socially-distanced, indoor or outdoor physical education.</p>
 <p>Wear your mask if you are standing up.</p>	<p>Every time pupils stand up, they must wear a mask. This includes during playtime in the garden. With a mask on, physical distance may be reduced for example when queueing or playing. For this reason, snacks will be consumed while seated but afterwards, if they are wearing their masks, pupils may get up. The school will supply surgical masks for changing during school hours.</p>
 <p>If you are not well or are in any doubt about your physical condition, talk to the teacher or collaborator. Listen to their indications at all times.</p>	<p>If a teacher notices flu-like symptoms such as a temperature over 37.5°C and/or sore throat, nasal congestion, conjunctivitis, reduced sense of smell/taste or vomiting, the pupil in question must be isolated in a specific classroom and their family must be notified. Parents must pick up their children AS SOON AS POSSIBLE. It is therefore a good idea to delegate more than one person to pick up a pupil. It will then be necessary to advise the child's pediatrician, who will provide the necessary instructions. Readmission to school after illness Covid-19 will be permitted on presentation of a MEDICAL CERTIFICATE.</p>
